Enclosed please find the Order of Conditions issued by the Natick Conservation Commission at their meeting April 23, 2009 DEP file #233-641.

Project Location: Lake Cochituate, Natick, MA

Chapter 131 Section 40 of the Massachusetts General Laws requires that this Order of Conditions be recorded in the Registry of Deeds for the District in which the land is located before any work commences. A copy of such recording, showing Book and Page number, is to be furnished to the Natick Conservation Commission.

Work may not begin until the petitioner has duly recorded the Order of Conditions and until the ten (10) day period for appeals has elapsed. Work may also not begin until after all agreements or covenants as required by this Order of Conditions have been received and approved by the Natick Conservation Commission.

Any site work being done which is subject to the Order of Conditions shall display a sign, clearly visible from a traveled way, of not less than two (2) square feet or more than three (3) square feet in area, bearing the words "Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection File No. 233-6400."

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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act

(only applicable to approved projects)

- 1. Failure to comply with all conditions stated herein, and with all related statutes and other regulatory measures, shall be deemed cause to revoke or modify this Order.
- 2. The Order does not grant any property rights or any exclusive privileges; it does not authorize any injury to private property or invasion of private rights.
- 3. This Order does not relieve the permittee or any other person of the necessity of complying with all other applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances, bylaws, or regulations.
- 4. The work authorized hereunder shall be completed within three years from the date of this Order unless either of the following apply:
 - a. the work is a maintenance dredging project as provided for in the Act; or
 - b. the time for completion has been extended to a specified date more than three years, but less than five years, from the date of issuance. If this Order is intended to be valid for more than three years, the extension date and the special circumstances warranting the extended time period are set forth as a special condition in this Order.
- 5. This Order may be extended by the issuing authority for one or more periods of up to three years each upon application to the issuing authority at least 30 days prior to the expiration date of the Order.
- 6. Any fill used in connection with this project shall be clean fill. Any fill shall contain no trash, refuse, rubbish, or debris, including but not limited to lumber, bricks, plaster, wire, lath, paper, cardboard, pipe, tires, ashes, refrigerators, motor vehicles, or parts of any of the foregoing.
- 7. This Order is not final until all administrative appeal periods from this Order have elapsed, or if such an appeal has been taken, until all proceedings before the Department have been completed.
- 8. No work shall be undertaken until the Order has become final and then has been recorded in the Registry of Deeds or the Land Court for the district in which the land is located, within the chain of title of the affected property. In the case of recorded land, the Final Order shall also be noted in the Registry's Grantor Index under the name of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is to be done. In the case of the registered land, the Final Order shall also be noted on the Land Court Certificate of Title of the owner of the land upon which the proposed work is done. The recording information shall be submitted to this Conservation Commission on the form at the end of this Order, which form must be stamped by the Registry of Deeds, prior to the commencement of work.
- A sign shall be displayed at the site not less then two square feet or more than three square feet in size bearing the words,

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C. General Conditions Under Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act

- 10. Where the Department of Environmental Protection is requested to issue a Superseding Order, the Conservation Commission shall be a party to all agency proceedings and hearings before DEP.
- 11. Upon completion of the work described herein, the applicant shall submit a Request for Certificate of Compliance (WPA Form 8A) to the Conservation Commission.
- 12. The work shall conform to the plans and special conditions referenced in this order.
- 13. Any change to the plans identified in Condition #12 above shall require the applicant to inquire of the Conservation Commission in writing whether the change is significant enough to require the filing of a new Notice of Intent.
- 14. The Agent or members of the Conservation Commission and the Department of Environmental Protection shall have the right to enter and inspect the area subject to this Order at reasonable hours to evaluate compliance with the conditions stated in this Order, and may require the submittal of any data deemed necessary by the Conservation Commission or Department for that evaluation.
- 15. This Order of Conditions shall apply to any successor in interest or successor in control of the property subject to this Order and to any contractor or other person performing work conditioned by this Order.
- 16. Prior to the start of work, and if the project involves work adjacent to a Bordering Vegetated Wetland, the boundary of the wetland in the vicinity of the proposed work area shall be marked by wooden stakes or flagging. Once in place, the wetland boundary markers shall be maintained until a Certificate of Compliance has been issued by the Conservation Commission.
- 17. All sedimentation barriers shall be maintained in good repair until all disturbed areas have been fully stabilized with vegetation or other means. At no time shall sediments be deposited in a wetland or water body. During construction, the applicant or his/her designee shall inspect the erosion controls on a daily basis and shall remove accumulated sediments as needed. The applicant shall immediately control any erosion problems that occur at the site and shall also immediately notify the Conservation Commission, which reserves the right to require additional erosion and/or damage prevention controls it may deem necessary. Sedimentation barriers shall serve as the limit of work unless another limit of work line has been approved by this Order.



SPECIAL CONDITIONS LAKE COCHITUATE AQUATIC PLANT MANAGEMENT PROGRAM MIDDLE POND – DCR BEACH AND BOAT RAMP Order of Conditions – 233-641

- 1. The Commission reserves the right to impose additional conditions or require the submittal of additional information as necessary to protect the interests of the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act, M.G.L. c. 131, 40 ("Act").
- 2. If any change is made or intended to be made in the plan, the applicant shall file a new Notice of Intent, or shall inquire in writing of the Commission whether the change necessitates a new filing.
- 3. The applicant shall submit to the Commission a written request for a Certificate of Compliance once the activity has been completed.
- 4. The Natick Conservation Commission and the Commission's agents shall have the right to observe and inspect the operations to evaluate compliance with this Order of Conditions, and may require the submittal of any data necessary for such evaluation.
- 5. The applicant shall notify the Commission in writing of any changes in Personnel so responsible, together with the appropriate names, addresses and phone numbers.
- 6. The applicant shall provide 48 hours notice to the Commission prior to beginning activities on site.
- 7. The applicant shall limit treatment to days when wind gusts are less than 20 miles per hour and there are no white caps on the surface of Middle Pond.
- 8. This order shall apply to any successor in control or successor in interest of the property described in the Notice of Intent and accompany plans.
- 9. The directing engineer or designated manager, shall have a copy of the permit and Notice of Intent at the site, be familiar with the documents and adhere to those conditions.
- 10. If any unforeseen problem occurs during the activity which affects any of the statutory interests of the Act and/or the Natick Wetland Bylaw, upon discovery, the applicant shall notify the Commission, and an immediate meeting shall be held between the Commission, the applicant, the engineer, contractor, and other concerned parties to determine the corrective measures to be employed. The applicant shall then act to correct the problem using the corrective measures agreed upon.

- 11. Servicing and repair of motorized watercraft shall take place at least 100 feet from the edge of all wetland resource areas. Refueling of motorized watercraft shall take place using standard operating procedures, including reference and adherence to owner's manual for proper refueling procedures.
- 12. Equipment operators shall be prepared to respond immediately to any accidental releases of fuel, motor oil, aquatic herbicides or other liquids. There shall be absorbent materials available on site at all times for use in containing spills. If an accidental release occurs, the applicant/operator shall immediately notify the state.
- 13. This approval is for only one application of Reward (Diquat) herbicide this spring (2009) to control nuisance aquatic vegetation, namely Eurasian Water Milfoil (Myriophyllium Spicatium) in a small area in the northwest corner of Middle Pond abutting the state beach and boat ramp. Maximum treatment area proposed project is 5 acres. Any future treatments will require an additional written approval of the Commission.
- 14. The Applicant's contractor, Aquatic Control Technology, Inc., shall provide a copy of the MA DEP License to Apply Chemicals prior to any herbicide treatment.
- 15. A written notice of the pending treatment shall be placed in at least two daily newspaper of general distribution in the Natick area (the Boston Globe and the Metrowest Daily News) and one weekly newspaper of general distribution in the Natick area (the Natick Bulletin) by the Friday prior to the scheduled day of treatment.
- 16. Printed posters in English, Portuguese, Chinese, Vietnamese and Spanish, or with universal signage, providing the date of treatment and temporary water use restrictions to be imposed, shall be posted around the entirety of the shoreline of Middle Pond, lake park parking areas and within 200 feet of either direction from (and including) the State Beach and Boat Ramp on Middle Pond. Posters shall be put up on the Friday prior to treatment. Treatment shall occur only on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday of the week. The restrictions in Special Condition 17 shall be included in the posters pursuant to the Special Condition (#16).
- 17. The restrictions for Middle Pond are as follows: no swimming or boating on the day of treatment and one additional day; no fishing on the day of treatment and one additional day; no irrigation or watering livestock for 5 days; and no use of the lake water for drinking or domestic uses of lake water in Middle Pond for 3 days.
- 18. The applicant shall comply with all laws and regulations governing the handling and application of Reward (Diquat).

- 19. Prior to treatment, a plant survey map of the proposed 5 acres area to be treated shall identify water milfoil plant densities and shall be given to the NCC at least 48 hours prior to any chemical application.
- 20. A post treatment plant survey map of the treated area shall be given to the NCC within two weeks of treatment.
- 21. Treatment in the proposed 5 acres area shall be followed with hand pulling of stalks and roots of water milfoil.
- 22. The applicant shall prepare a water and sediment Diquut sampling plan to be reviewed and approved by the NCC prior to treatment. The plan will outline pretreatment and post-treatment sample collection locations and sample frequencies. The samples will be tested for the presence of Diquat at a state certified laboratory. The test results shall be sent to the NCC within two days of their receipt from the laboratory.
- 23. The applicant shall make arrangements with the Natick Water Department to sample and test the Evergreen Wells for Diquat before treatment, 30 days following treatment and quarterly thereafter for two years.
- 24. A written report summarizing the chemical treatment operations (areas/acreage treated chemicals and quantity applied, relative effectiveness of treatment) and results of the Diquat testing program, shall be provided to the Commission within 90 days of treatment.
- 25. The applicant shall perform a pilot test in Lake Cochituate prior to August 30, 2010 of a mechanical harvester such as a Diver Assisted Suction Harvester (DASH) boat, or similar technology, pursuant to a subsequent Order of Conditions. The applicant shall submit a report to the NCC detailing the results of the pilot test and an evaluation of its effectiveness in controlling or managing Eurasian Milfoil within one month of completing the pilot test.

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F. Appeals

The applicant, the owner, any person aggrieved by this Order, any owner of land abutting the land subject to this Order, or any ten residents of the city or town in which such land is located, are hereby notified of their right to request the appropriate DEP Regional Office to issue a Superseding Order of Conditions. The request must be made by certified mail or hand delivery to the Department, with the appropriate filing fee and a completed Request of Departmental Action Fee Transmittal Form, as provided in 310 CMR 10.03(7) within ten business days from the date of issuance of this Order. A copy of the request shall at the same time be sent by certified mail or hand delivery to the Conservation Commission and to the applicant, if he/she is not the appellant.

The request shall state clearly and concisely the objections to the Order which is being appealed and how the Order does not contribute to the protection of the interests identified in the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act, (M.G.L. c. 131, § 40) and is inconsistent with the wetlands regulations (310 CMR 10.00). To the extent that the Order is based on a municipal ordinance or bylaw, and not on the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act or regulations, the Department has no appellate jurisdiction.
